Democracy Barometer

Happy Families

(Rules for 3 or more players)

The Deck of 32 cards consists of 8 families. Each family has 4 cards of the same nation with the years 2000, 2005, 2010 and 2015.

A player shuffles all cards and deals them to the players as equal as possible. All players hold their cards so that other players cannot see their card faces. The player to the left of the dealer starts as the active player.

Only the active player takes turns: On their turn the active player chooses one other player and asks them for a specific card (nation and year; e.g. Switzerland 2000). A player may only ask for a nation they hold a card from themselves. If the questioned player has the card they must give it to the active player, who then stays active player. If the questioned player does not have the card they become the new active player. The active player takes a new turn.

Once a player holds a family with all four cards of a nation, these cards are placed in front of them on the table. Whoever runs out of cards in their hands is eliminated from the game. Once all players are eliminated, the game ends. The player with the most families in front of them wins the game.

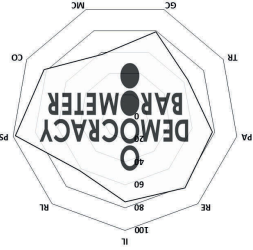

Democracy Barometer Top Trump

(Rules for 2 or more players)

The game consists of 32 cards. Each card has 9 attributes, indicating a function and it's value.

A player shuffles all cards and deals them to the players as equal as possible. All players hold their cards in a face up stack so that only the top card face is visible and the other players cannot see it. The player to the left of the dealer starts as the active player.

The active player names one function. Then all players read out the corresponding card values on their top cards. The player with the highest value receives all top cards of the other players, places them face up to the bottom of their stack and becomes the new active player to start a new game round. Whoever runs out of cards is eliminated from the game. The player who manages to collect all cards wins the game.

If any players are tied for their highest card value this is resolved in a tiebreaker round: All players place their top card in the middle of the table and the last active player names one function. Now only the tied players read out the corresponding card values on their top cards. The player with the highest value wins the tie and receives all the top cards of the tied players plus the cards on the table.
